God's Place is First Place

Exodus 20 starts out with "The Ten Commandments." The first six verses are geared towards God being number one in our lives. For most, making, placing, and keeping God as number one is not an easy task and at some point we all have struggled to maintain that standard.

Verse three is clear, "You shall have no other gods before me." The term "god" (emphasis on the lower-case g) is synonymous for idols, things, or images. These gods can range from people, jobs, careers, money, cars, clothes, ideas, shoes, concepts, etc. the list can go on forever. Notice how these gods can be tangible or intangible. Verse four states that we should not make an image in the form of anything in heaven

above or on the earth or in the waters.

Whether we envision this idol mentally or physically create it, it is a big red flag to our faith especially in terms of our worship towards God.

Don't think that this means we can't like things such as cars, clothes, or people. It means don't let those things overshadow who God is and what He has done for us. It also means our wants and desires are not to turn into our idols and take first place in our thoughts and actions making God secondary. Doing so clearly goes against God's will causing us to sin. For example, the desire to live a fulfilling life and have a successful career is 100% okay until that desire causes a person to compromise their walk with the Lord. Compromising in the form of not studying their Bible as much, not attending church regularly, not praying, etc.

God tells us that placing Him other than first will have consequences, and the effects are long lasting and detrimental. Not only will it affect us now, in the present, but it will impact our lineage too. How unfortunate it is that we and future generations can be experiencing the wrath of God based on what our ancestors did. While that is a tough pill to swallow, there is hope! There are opportunities every day to prevent us and future generations from encountering such punishment. We must keep God first in our lives and for the rest of our lives! The benefit is stated in verse six. He loves those who keep His commandments. Let us not delay and make the rest of our lives the best of our lives!
